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
#### **UPLB Library News: Event Highlights**

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# InfoLit Advanced: Enhancing Information Literacy Skills at UPLB

InfoLit Advanced, the fourth component of InfoSkilled -the newly rebranded Information Literacy Program of the UPLB University Library —was launched via Zoom on 11-12 April 2024. The event featured four sessions where InfoSkilled Librarians discussed essential information literacy skills: identifying, finding, evaluating, and acknowledging information. This program aims to equip participants with the necessary knowledge and skills to access information effectively and efficiently, fostering lifelong learning.

In his welcome remarks, Dr. Agham C. Cuevas, Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, highlighted advanced the importance of information literacy skills in today's digital age. He hoped the program would "help cultivate capable of informed citizens discerning, evaluating, and utilizing information effectively in all aspects of life."


Ms. Rosa Salvacion R. Bombales, College Librarian at the University Archives and Knowledge Repository Section, kicked off the first session, "Identify," discussing the research problem identification process and concept mapping techniques. She provided а working document to be used in the subsequent sessions. In "Find," Ms. Ella Marie S. Daradar, College Librarian at the General References and Information Services Section, shared search strategies and tools to find and retrieve relevant literature from the various online databases, compiling a list of resources for the next session.

On the second day, Mr. Jarien G. Galorio, College Librarian at the Resources Electronic and Multimedia Services Section, led "Evaluate," the session on introducing criteria for assessing information sources' accuracy across various formats. He emphasized the importance of evaluating information to produce quality research.

Ms. Christine G. Balmes, College Librarian at the Cataloging and Classification Section, concluded the series with "Acknowledge," stressing the role of citing and referencing in academic and professional writing to avoid plagiarism. She provided hands-on training with Mendeley and tips for using Turnitin, for similarity detection.

The event was emceed by Mx. Lorman D. Hidalgo with Ms. Jovilyn C. Albay and Ms. Gladys Joy S. Domingo facilitating the open fora on each day.

Approximately 60 participants from various UPLB colleges Postattended each session. learning activities were provided, and InfoSkilled merchandise was awarded to top-performing participants. University Librarian Dr. Mary Ann M. Ingua concluded the event with closing remarks, expressing gratitude and encouraging participants to continue nurturing their skills and knowledge for a brighter academic and professional future.



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## CPAf Unveils Its Newly Renovated Library



The College of Public Affairs and Development (CPAf) Library recently opened its doors and unveiled its new look on Wednesday, June 19, 2024.

Under the direct supervision of the Knowledge Management Office (KMO), the library offers enhanced resources supporting CPAF's academic program and research initiatives. ## Library REPS work to standardize workplan

The Staff Training & Development Committee Series I held the UPLB Library REPS Workplan Workshop on March 8, 2024, at the CVM Zootechniques, College of Veterinary Medicine, UPLB, College, Laguna. The workshop aimed to: 1) Standardize the different processes of each activity or project; 2) Establish standardized points for each process; and 3) Define target outputs and deliverables for every six months. Additionally, the workshop aimed to define the roles of program and project leaders responsible for monitoring implementation and to identify the team members.

The UPLB Library Workplan was aligned with the three themes discussed during the UPLB 2024-2026 Strategic Planning Workshop. They are: Theme 1. Teaching, Research, Innovation, and Creative Works for a Sustainable Society; Theme 2. Public Service for the Common Good, and; Theme 3. Consultative and Accountable Governance for the Wellbeing of University Constituents.

Forty-five (45) Library REPS (2 Librarians, 40 College Librarians, and 3 University Researchers) from the Main Library and Unit Libraries attended the workshop.

- Interested parties may send thru email the paper/s that they wish to run using Turnitin.
- For initial submissions, no exclusions and no limits would be set by default for the following:
  - Quotations, cited references or bibliography, number of words, and percentage of text similarity
- For succeeding submission, the requesting client may opt to signify their preferred settings.

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# Turnitin

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How to use Turnitin Draft Coach via Google Docs extensions?

Step 1: Hover the mouse over <u>"Extensions"</u> and select <u>"Turnitin</u> <u>Draft Coach"</u> and wait for the pop-up sidebar to appear.

Step 2: Navigate the sidebar and choose whether to check

- similarities
- citations
- or grammar.

Step 3: Wait for the results and edit/revise.

# **AI Guides**

These are some helpful AI tools you can use to study and/or organize your notes, documents, or files

#### 1: Ask Your PDF

An interactive and conversational chatbot that can explain the content of a PDF file. URL: <u>https://askyourpdf.com/</u>

#### 2: Barely AI

An app that organizes your files that you read, write, and created. URL: <u>bearly.ai</u>

#### 3. Gizmo AI

An AI tool that creates a quizlet out of your file and organizes the data in folders. URL: <u>gizmo.ai</u>



# **Boolean Operators**

# Boolean operators will help you navigate online search engines more efficiently and prioritize <u>desired search results</u>.

- 1. Using <u>AND</u> between two or more words to lessen confusing search results combined. Provides results that contain both or all keywords. **Example: doctorate AND Europe**
- 2. Using <u>OR</u> between two or more words to broaden the search results altogether. Provides results that contain either keyword. Example: reptiles OR amphibians OR fish
- 3. Using <u>NOT</u> to distinguish what to exclude from the search results. **Examples: amphibians NOT** reptiles.
- Using parentheses (\_) to mix/group together 2 or more boolean operators and control the order in which the terms will be searched. Example: Europe AND (residency OR education); Vertebrates OR (warm-blooded AND cold-blooded)
- Using quotation marks <u>""</u> to find the exact phrase in the context of the results.
   Example: "Farming communities in Quezon"



### **FOOD BOX: A Food Drive to Survive the Finals Week**

The UPLB University Library launched the Food Box initiative and extended its library hours from 8:00 am to 10:00 pm from May 27 to 31, 2024. This effort aims to support students by providing resources, extending study hours, and an optimal learning environment during finals week.

The Food Box initiative began in 2018 with the project title "Food Box: A Food Drive to Survive Finals Week," proposed by Vertex Communication students under Prof. Ma. Agnes Grossenbacher. It was developed in collaboration with the Social Media and Promotion Committee of the University Library.

Food boxes promote the principle of "Give and Take," where faculty, staff, and students donate items like biscuits, nuts, instant noodles, and coffee by simply dropping them into the box.

During the examination period, a variety of food was served to students in the University Library, with different dishes offered each day. 
